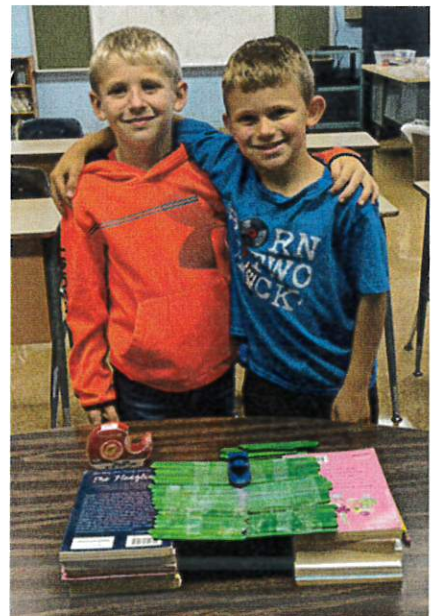
Landon has met our Book It goal for October. Good job! Keep on reading—October is already half over.
